## Na Te Kaiwhakahaere

### Ki a tātou nei ngā whānau o Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri - anei ngā korero o te Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri Iwi Trust

Tena tātou katōa

It is with considerable pleasure that I write this report to you. Whānau, our Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri whānau has made extraordinary progress on our Mandate. Straight after our AGM on September 28, we ran a mandate hui to form a Mandate Group to progress our pathway to Mandate. At that hui, whānau in attendance nominated the following people to the Group:

- Paula Page
- John Kamo

This Mandate Group met Monday 21 October to determine how we finalise mandate with you. At that hui it was agreed we would all travel to our Aotearoa based whānau to finalise our mandate with you by March 2014.

In the interim, you have been notified of the mandate strategy by both our Management team and Te Puni Kokiri. As a reminder, the Strategy is on our website [www.nmow.iwi.nz](http://www.nmow.iwi.nz). We already have received submissions. Just to let you know, we have decided not to close off the submission period. We really want your feedback and encourage you to comment either to us or to Te Puni Kokiri.

Whānau, we received a clear and unequivocal message from our people – it is time to conclude our settlement. We need to be united and working together. There is a real sense of purpose amongst our ahi kaa whānau and determination to move ahead.

This pānui accompanies a separate booklet that details aspects of our mandate and treaty claim approach. I urge you to visit our website as well where a number of papers are posted for your information.

In the meantime we've had a great period since our last pānui. There is a real sense of momentum on the island. Our AGM was a resounding success with good questioning from our whānau. To follow that with a great hui around mandate was so encouraging.

Our pūtea whanāungatanga has been well utilised in the last quarter. We had Pio Terei on island delivering his positive parenting message to our whānau. It was a resounding success as the report from CCFT shows.

Our Learning Day at the Marae culminated with an end of year kaumatua lunch with beautiful kai and an outstanding kapa haka performance from our future leaders.

Finally – the Iwi Trust has just received and signed a contract to develop our Ngāti Mutunga education strategy. We are focused on a cradle-to-the grave strategy to promote education (and Ngāti Mutungatanga) as a core component of our ahua on the island and in Aotearoa.

And we are also finalising a package of support with Te Taura Whiri to assist us in our reo recovery efforts. This again will likely comprise a strategic plan development and subsequent support for the implementation of the strategy. Exciting stuff!

Trustees, Mandate Group and Management look forward to seeing you all in February / March 2014.

Watching our boys grow with Taiaha into their Maoritanga is just marvellous. And now we hear there is a proposal to send some of our tamariki to a Taiaha wānanga in Rotorua in January 2014. Here's hoping some of our Aotearoa based Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri can join us.



## Reo Wānanga

Our tutors Rumatiki Timu, Bronwyn Pue were on island with us from 25 to 29 October. We are still early days with our reo recovery but we are going to get there.

The rumour mill is going – we hear that Te Taura Whiri has caught wind of what we are doing and is now working with the Iwi Trust to beef up our programme of reo recovery. This may include support to develop our own Wharekauri based tutors. Very exciting.

# Education Strategy

During the course of 2013 Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri Iwi Trust met with the Ministry of Education to develop a programme of assistance for our education aspirations.

The key education priorities identified were:

- To raise the achievement outcomes for tamariki, rangatahi and Iwi of Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri and the community of the Chatham Islands
- Increase provision, quality, and participation of Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri learners in ECE
- Strengthening literacy and numeracy outcomes for Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri learners in the three primary schools
- Ngāti Mutungatanga curriculum development and integration into local school curricula
- To build an education kokiri centre to connect all education opportunities for whānau and the community
- Contribute to building the capability and capacity of Kaiako in the schools and community education initiatives to build self-

sufficiency as an enabler of Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri tino rangatiratanga

- Imbed the identity of rangatahi as Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri
- Strengthen tamariki and rangatahi transitions:
  - i. From primary to secondary education
  - ii. From secondary to tertiary training
  - iii. From tertiary training to vocational pathways into careers relevant to Wharekauri
- Develop opportunities for Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri uri to be 'life-long-learners' e.g. every whānau has the ability to develop their own education plan utilising the learning centre as the educational hub to facilitate this.
- To work with partners who can assist Ngāti Mutunga o Wharekauri educational aspirations

The Ministry of Education has agreed to fund a programme of support to turn this priorities into a reality on Wharekauri. This programme of support includes provision for the recruitment of a person to develop the strategy in consultation with our Wharekauri iwi and community, to develop an implementation plan, and to action that implementation plan.

# Kaumātua Whakangahau

In December our Kaumatua joined together for lunch at Whakamaharatanga marae and afterwards the tamariki from Te One and Kaingaroa schools arrived for a concert. The tamariki performed for our Kaumatua and whanau, as a culmination of the weekly learning day at the marae. The tamariki were amazing performers and it was wonderful to see the growth in their confidence and knowledge. Special thanks must go out to the Principals and teaching staff of both schools for their encouragement and acknowledgement of Maori education.



# WAI64 Claims Material
